






<p>1. Start RVTools.</p> <p>2. Connect to the vCenter were the VM reside that needs upgrading.</p>	
<p>3. Click the 'vTools' tab.</p> <p>4. Scroll down to the VM.</p> <p>5. Select the VM by checking the checkbox.</p> <p>6. Click the 'Upgrade VMware Tools' button.</p>	
<p>7. Click 'Yes' if you want to continue the upgrade.</p>	
<p>8. Click 'OK'.</p>	
<p>9. The VMware Tools will start upgrading.</p>	
<p>Once the upgrade is triggered, a FORCED reboot will take place, it CANNOT be postponed!</p> <p>A reboot is required when remediating Virtual Machines. Be sure to coordinate the necessary downtime.</p>
